How Do We Remember People?

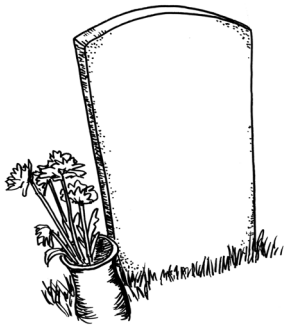
To “commemorate” means to remember and show respect for someone by doing something. Color in the different signs of commemoration you see.

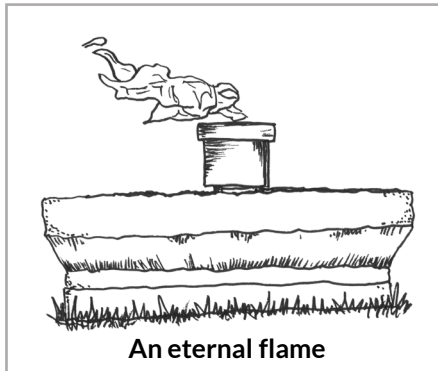

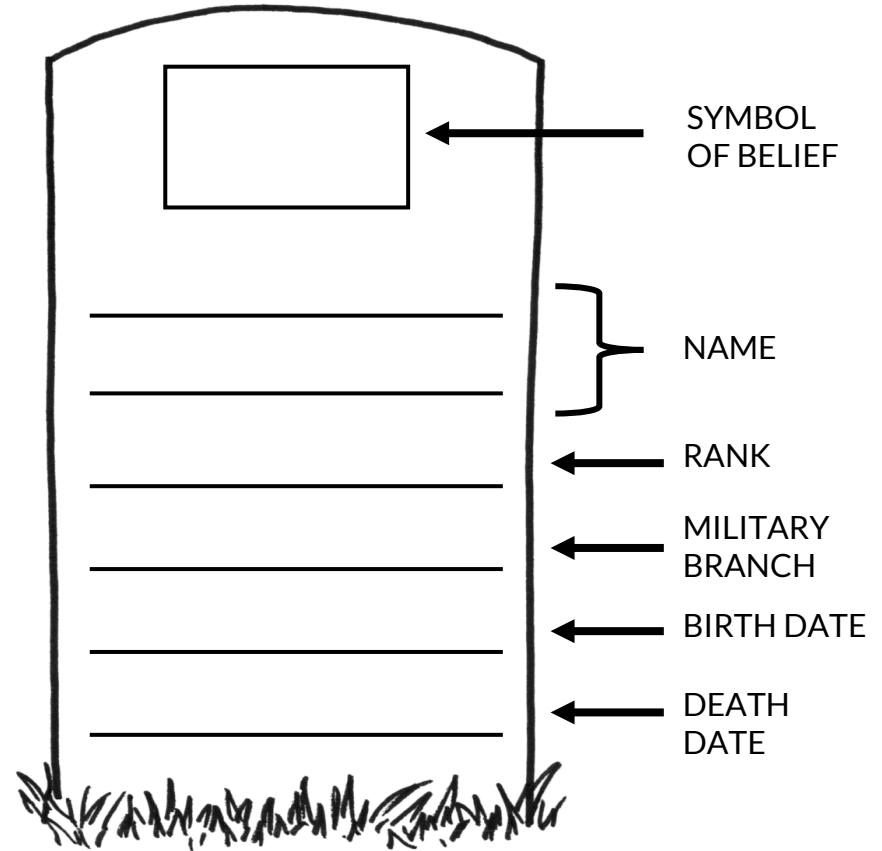
